Works to your home

As most of you will know, there are two major works programmes happening on the estate.

The first relates to making good any defects to the inside of tenants homes. This process is under way and it will deal with all the problems that you have experienced after Wates completed their works. However, there are also things that need to be done that may not yet be affecting you. This includes bad plumbing causing baths, sinks and toilets to block over time and problems with electrical installations.

It is therefore vital that Lambeth and Wates are allowed into your homes, firstly to carry out an inspection to agree what works are needed, and then to carry out the works.


If you are asked to contact either Lambeth or Wates to make an appointment, please do so. Alternatively, we have a member of Lambeth staff in the estate office every Monday morning, and there are always Wates representatives here.

The first programme is to deal with the outside of the blocks. Work is due to start on the estate in January. However the programme is likely to last for at least 18 months so works will not end until the summer of 2017.

The exact order in which the blocks will be repaired has yet to be decided, but we will put a firm programme onto our website as soon as it is available. We will also give everyone as much notice as possible as to when works are going to begin.

During works, we will also be looking to recruit block representatives so that the concerns of residents can be raised formally as part of the process. We will let you know the details as soon as possible about this.

Finally, we will be holding another meeting for all residents during December, where you will have a chance to meet the contractor carrying out the works, see some of the designs of the works and ask questions about what the works will mean to you.



Acting against Tenancy fraud

Tenancy fraud is taken very seriously by Roupell Park staff and by Lambeth Council. Also it is now a criminal offense punishable by a fine or imprisonment. Housing fraud, either getting a home through telling lies about personal circumstances or subletting a property, deprives someone who really needs it from getting a home.

We carry out regular visits to all of our properties to check who is living in them. In addition we investigate cases where we have our own suspicions or where we are alerted by a neighbour. We have recently evicted someone for tenancy fraud and are in the process of taking legal action against another.

If you think your neighbour is subletting their property, let us know. We will deal with any report confidentially and will investigate without letting anyone know how we got the information. Remember, tenancy fraud is a crime and you and your children are the victims.



Good housekeeping Rule No 1 Pay your rent

We know there are always extra pressures on money over Christmas, but paying your rent needs to be your top priority. We will continue to take action on all cases of rent arrears; and if you don't pay, you are putting your home at
